



Care Center at Sunset Lake Visitation Fact Sheet

- **All visitors will be screened for signs and symptoms for COVID-19.** Entry will be denied for those with signs or symptoms or those who have had close contact with someone with COVID-19 infection in the prior 14 days (regardless of vaccination status).
- **All visitors are required to wear a paper surgical mask, cloth masks are not permitted**
- **All visitors must provide a negative COVID -19 result within 24 hours prior to their visit to be permitted access to the facility, Rapid tests are available upon request for any that do not arrive at the facility with their negative result.**
 - If you test positive you will not be permitted access to the facility
 - Anyone with signs or symptoms of COVID-19 will not be permitted access to the facility.
- **Visitors will be asked about their vaccination status when arriving at the facility, though it is not required to be provided, providing this information to the facility would be helpful in the event of an outbreak.**
- Hand hygiene must be performed before and after visitation and between contact with residents (use of alcohol-based hand rub is preferred).
- The use of surgical masks is required, the facility will provide if needed.
- Social distancing of at least six feet between persons is encouraged
- Outdoor visitation is always preferred, even when the resident and visitor are fully vaccinated against COVID-19.
- Visitation will occur in our visitation space or in a residents room. If social distancing cannot be maintained in the resident room other areas of the facility may be requested to be used for visitation for larger number of visitors.
- If a visitor tests positive for COVID-19 and has visited the facility within 2 days of their positive result or onset of symptoms they must notify the facility immediately so we can conduct contact tracing.
- **The facility encourages all visitors to be fully vaccinated and/or tested for covid-19 (PCR or Antigen within 3-5 days of visit) before a visit.**
- Documentation must include the following for each visitor to the nursing home: first and last name of the visitor; physical (street) address of the visitor; daytime and evening telephone number; date and time of visit; and email address, if available.
- If a resident's roommate is unvaccinated or immunocompromised (regardless of vaccination status), visits should not be conducted in the resident's room, if possible.
